

ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS

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CITY OF MADISON, ILLINOIS  
HOURLY EQUIPMENT RATES

Separate sealed bids for Hourly Equipment Rates will be received by the City Clerk in the City Hall, Madison, Illinois until 10:00 a.m., Tuesday, April 16, 2019 at which time the bids will be publicly opened and read aloud.

Item 1 - proposed work consists of furnishing all equipment and operators to perform **BUILDING DEMOLITIONS** and other various items of work as specified by the City of Madison.

Item 2 - proposed work consists of furnishing all equipment and operators to perform **SEWER CLEANING AND/OR TELEVISIONING** various combined size sewers and/or storm sewers, as specified by the City of Madison, on an as needed basis.

Item 3 – proposed work consists of furnishing all equipment and operators to perform **HAULING AND/OR AGGREGATE MATERIAL** from a borrow site or supplier to various sites in Madison, as requested.

Item 4 – proposed work consists of furnishing all equipment and operators to **PERFORM COMPACTION OF EARTH AND/OR AGGREGATE MATERIAL**, as required (i.e. Sheeps Foot Roller, vibrating compactor, etc.)

Respective bidders shall furnish a list of all available equipment with applicable hourly rates which, shall include operators. These rates will be used for a period of one year (May 1, 2019 to April 30, 2020). A separate list of equipment with applicable hourly rates/operators shall be submitted for each item that a bidder wishes to bid. Bidders may bid any of the listed items separately and do not have to bid all items to submit. Bids that are furnished by mail shall be addressed to the City Clerk, City of Madison, 615 Madison Avenue, Madison, Illinois 62060.

No bidder may withdraw his bid within ninety (90) days of the scheduled time of closing bids.

All bids must be made on forms furnished by the City of Madison.

Illinois law requires that contractors pay the prevailing wage rates as determined by the Department of Labor.

The City of Madison reserves the right to waive, or not to waive, any irregularities in the bids and to reject any or all bids and to determine which is the lowest and best bid.

## SPECIAL PROVISIONS

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### CITY OF MADISON HOURLY EQUIPMENT RATES

#### GENERAL

1. The intent of this specification is to establish hourly equipment rates, which will be used for citywide building demolition projects, sewer cleaning and televising, earthwork and/or aggregate hauling and compaction of earth and/or aggregate. However, the City reserves the right to use the equipment for other projects (i.e., curb and gutter, sidewalk, pavement). In the event the low bidder is not available within 48 hours of notification by the City, the next lowest bidder will be asked to perform the work.
2. The following explanation of the bid form items is made for the information and guidance of bidders. Omission in this description of reference to an item shall not, however, alter the intent of the bid form or relieve the Contractor of the necessity of furnishing such items as a part of the contract.
  - a. Payment will be made on the basis of work actually performed at the hourly rates in this bid form as accepted.
  - b. The bidder shall submit the make, model and horsepower rating of each piece of equipment for which a bid is submitted. The City will determine if that particular equipment is suitable for the proposed work. If the City determines the proposed equipment is not suitable for the work, the next lowest bidder with the proper equipment will be selected.
  - c. Each piece of equipment will include an operator and all costs associated with transporting the equipment to and from the job site, fuel and insurance. The tractor with flatbed and driver will be used to haul city-owned equipment to or from a jobsite. A lump sum or flat rate will be defined as leaving the bidder's yard, loading the piece of equipment at the place specified by the City, delivery and unloading the piece of equipment at the place specified by the City and returning to the bidder's yard.
