

Madison City Council  
March 19, 2019  
Minutes

The City Council meeting was called to order by Mayor Hamm at 6:30 p.m. followed by a request for roll call. Present were Alderpersons Jenkins, Bridick, Vrabec, Hampsey, Glasper, Riskovsky, Gardner and Haynes. Absent: None.

All present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

It was moved by Alderman Bridick, seconded by Alderman Haynes, to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held on March 5, 2019. Voice vote as follows: eight (8) ayes; no nays. Absent: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Alderman Bridick, seconded by Alderman Haynes, to approve the minutes of the special meeting held on March 5, 2019. Voice vote as follows: eight (8) ayes; no nays. Absent: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Alderman Vrabec, seconded by Alderman Bridick, to approve the presentation of Claims as submitted by the Comptroller. Voice vote as follows: eight (8) ayes; no nays. Absent: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Alderman Vrabec, seconded by Alderman Bridick that bills be allowed as drawn on the treasury and as presented, unless there are any questions of the Comptroller, for 03/06/2019 through 03/19/2019, in the amount of \$153,404.63. Roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Jenkins, Bridick, Vrabec, Glasper, Riskovsky, Gardner and Haynes. Nays: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Alderman Vrabec, seconded by Alderman Bridick that the Comptroller's report for March 6, 2019 through March 19, 2019 be accepted as presented and placed on file unless there are questions for the Comptroller. Voice vote as follows: eight (8) ayes; no nays. Absent: None. Motion carried.

There were no appointments by Mayor Hamm.

A member of the public, Donald Turner, update the Council on the upcoming kickball season. Brad Hoffman, Illinois Public Risk Fund, addressed the Council regarding the City's risk management insurance. He stated that the City of Madison last year started the Madison Safety Committee and that Madison had improved significantly under the risk management program. Previously Madison has a five-year loss ratio of 90% against premiums when they started the program in March 2018. However, the City finished the year with only \$13,000 in claims which is down from over \$130,000 in the previous year. Because of this reduction the City of Madison received a return on its premium of \$20,173 which was presented to Mayor Hamm by check from the Illinois Public Risk Fund.

Chief Nicholas Gailius provided his monthly state of the Police Department for February 2019. Chief Gailius provided a synopsis of activities conducted by the department during February 2019 which included a total of 388 recorded police activities for the month and a breakdown of crime reports. There being no other reports, it was moved by Alderman Haynes, seconded by Alderman Jenkins, to accept the reports of the Department Officers as presented. Voice vote as follows: eight (8) ayes; no nays. Absent: None. Motion carried.

It was moved by Alderman Vrabec, seconded by Alderman Bridick, to accept the resignation of Comptroller Robert Robbins after 48 years of service effective May 10, 2019. Roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Jenkins, Vrabec, Glasper, Riskovsky, Gardner and Haynes. Nays: None. Abstain: Bridick. Absent: None. Motion carried.

There were no other reports of the committees.


