

Madison City Council  
Minutes  
July 19, 2021

The City Council meeting was called to order by Mayor John Hamm at 6:00 p.m., Follow by request for roll call. Present were: Alderpersons Browley, Crochrell, Dixon, Hampsey, Haynes, Jenkins, Johnson and Vrabec Absent: none

All present recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

It was moved by Alderman Haynes, seconded by Alderman Browley, to approve the minutes of the regular Council meeting held on July 6, 2021. Voice vote as follows: six (8) ayes; no nays Absent: none. Motion carried.

It was moved by Alderman Vrabec, seconded by Alderwoman Hampsey, to approve the presentation of the Comptroller's Report as submitted and that bills be allowed as drawn on the treasury and presented to the Council, unless there are any questions of the Summary of Expenses for the period of July 7, 2021 through July 19, 2021 in the amount of \$207,509.48. The Comptroller's Report was accepted as presented, to be placed on file. Roll call as follows: Browley, Crochrell, Dixon, Hampsey, Haynes, Jenkins, Johnson and Vrabec. Motion carried.

Members of Public:

Citizen Carolyn Manning addressed the council regarding her neighbor's dog not being on a leased and coming on her property. She has requested the neighbor to keep control of her dogs, she has contacted the Police Department. She is requesting that action be taken according to the City Ordinance regarding the dogs. The Mayor did state he had sent the officers over previously to speak with the neighbor. He requested Mrs. Manning to go to the Police Station to fill out the proper paperwork. The Mayor will follow up.

Alderwoman Jenkins spoke and advise it is a problem with pit bulls running freely around. She is asking if this can be addressed. The Mayor will connect with the Humane department on getting the issue resolved.

Motion to have a Public Hearing regarding the Budget on July 26, 2021 at 5:30pm. Voice vote as follows: six (8) ayes; no nays Absent: none. Motion carried.

It was moved to accept reports from department officer voice vote as follow Six (8) ayes no nays. Absent none. Motion carried.

It was moved by Alderman Vrabec and seconded by Alderman Hampsey to have a Special Meeting on July 26, 2021 at 6:00pm to pass the FY 2022 Budget roll call vote as follows: Browley, Crochrell, Dixon, Hampsey, Haynes, Jenkins, Johnson and Vrabec Absent none Motion Carried

It was moved by Alderman Hampsey, seconded by Alderman Haynes to approve the request to open bids for 921 Jefferson Street Voice vote as follow Eight (8) ayes no nays. Absent none. Motion carried.

It was moved by Alderman Hampsey, seconded by Alderman Haynes to approve the bid for 921 Jefferson Street. roll call vote as follows: Browley, Crochrell, Dixon, Hampsey, Haynes, Jenkins, Johnson and Vrabec Absent none. Motion carried.

It was moved by Alderman Vrabec, seconded by Alderman Hampsey to hire Harold Sullivan from the Park and Recreation Department to the Street Department and Hire John Tay Henderson for the Park and Recreation Department roll call vote as follows: Browley, Crochrell, Dixon, Hampsey, Haynes, Jenkins, Johnson and Vrabec Absent none. Motion carried.

It was moved by Alderman Vrabec, seconded by Alderman Browley to approve the Back to School Book Bag Giveaway by The Tabernacle of Truth Church on July 31, 2021 from 11 am to 3 pm. Street Voice vote as follow Eight (8) ayes no nays. Absent none. Motion carried.

It was some discussion regarding the Musical Event request from Kramdens Bar and Grill. The Mayor address the council and advise he believe there is an Ordinance on record regarding No Live Bands at the Local Bars. The council requested the Mayor to locate the ordinance and provide to them.

It was moved by Alderman Crochwell, seconded by Alderwoman Dixon to approve the Musical Event on July 23rd at Kramdens Bar & Grill from 9pm to 1 am Sponsor by Bigya Khadka Voice vote as follow Six (6) ayes Two (2) nays. Absent none. Motion carried.

It was moved by Alderman Vrabec, seconded by Alderman Dixon to approve the Basketball Event on August 7, 2021 at 12pm until N/A Sponsor by Greater Graced Ministry, Ruby Blair and Doris Harrell Voice vote as follow Eight (8) ayes no nays. Absent none. Motion carried.


