NOTICE TO BIDDERS

6TH STREET RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT

Separate sealed bids for the 6TH STREET RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT will be received by the MAYOR'S OFFICE in the City of Madison, Illinois 62060 until 10:00 a.m. CST, July 15, 2022, at which time the bids will be publicly opened and read aloud. Sealed bids should be labeled "6TH STREET RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT" on the outside of the envelope.

The proposed work consists of:

The placement of a Portland cement concrete pavement, sub-base granular material, B-6.24 curb and gutter, concrete driveways, concrete sidewalk, storm sewers, inlets, pavement markings, signs and all other necessary collateral work to complete the project shown on the plans and as specified.

Bids that are furnished by mail shall be addressed to the City of Madison, 615 Madison Avenue, Madison, IL 62060.

Copies of the plans and specifications may be obtained upon the deposit of \$50.00 for each set. Deposits will be totally refunded to prime general contractors submitting a bid upon return of the plans and specifications in good condition within twenty (20) calendar days after the opening of the bids. An additional non-refundable charge of \$10.00 to cover the cost of postage and handling is required for those contractors requesting plans and specifications be mailed to them. Digital copies of the plans and specifications may be obtained at no cost upon Engineer's receipt of a completed request/release form provided by Engineer.

Plans, specifications and contract documents are also available for examination at Southern Illinois Builders in O'Fallon, Illinois.

No bidder may withdraw his bid within ninety (90) days of the scheduled time of closing bids.

All proposals must be made on forms furnished by the City of Madison.

The successful bidder will be required to execute and present performance and payment bonds in a sum equal to the full amount of the contract. Bids must be for the contract as a whole.

The successful bidder will be required to agree that not less than the prevailing rate of wages as determined by the Secretary of Labor and made a part of these contract documents shall be paid to all laborers, workmen and mechanics performing their work under this contract. This project will be subject to a Project Labor Agreement.

The City of Madison reserves the right to waive, or not to waive, any irregularities in the bids and to reject any or all bids and to determine which is the lowest and best bid.
